STEP 3:

Outreach – two-step process

Make a connection/intro by thanking and telling about the impact their gift/service/experience/advocacy has in relation to your club/children/community

Schedule an in-person meeting to go into more detail

What makes our club and Kiwanis so special? (One minute speech)

Ask and answer questions

Know your club dues structure

STEP 4:

Invite and Follow Up, Follow Up, Follow Up

Invite to a club service project or meeting

Give a reminder call prior to club meeting or service project they'll be attending

Secure answers to questions and call them back

Send a handwritten note of thanks – using touchpoints specific to this prospect

Start including them in your newsletter distribution

Reach out with activities that would be meaningful to them

Ask them to join your amazing Kiwanis club!
