Rocky Mountain District – Club Strengthening Growth Plan

Actions: Invite members with intent and connection

Goal: Thrive and be healthy - Clubs reach charter strength/Net Gain

Major key points

STEP 1:

Strategically identify 24 people (create list in September)

Involve as many club members as possible in the process

Reach beyond family/friends – already have a relationship with us

Have a connection to the club/mission/children/service

No cold calling during this process

STEP 2:

Identify two club members to reach out to prospects each month

Work in pairs to strategize – frontload best lead generator

Script activity – your one-minute speech

Why my club?

What's our community impact?

How do we make an impact?

STEP 3:

Outreach – two-step process

Make a connection/intro by thanking and telling about the impact their gift/service/experience/advocacy has in relation to your club/children/community

Schedule an in-person meeting to go into more detail

What makes our club and Kiwanis so special? (One minute speech)

Ask and answer questions

Know your club dues structure

STEP 4:

Invite and Follow Up, Follow Up, Follow Up

Invite to a club service project or meeting

Give a reminder call prior to club meeting or service project they'll be attending

Secure answers to questions and call them back

Send a handwritten note of thanks – using touchpoints specific to this prospect

Start including them in your newsletter distribution

Reach out with activities that would be meaningful to them

Ask them to join your amazing Kiwanis club!
