## DCSD Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program

Jodi Little joined us at our May 7th meeting to update us on the DCSD Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program.

*Student learning happens with good hearing.*

A bond was passed last year that is allowing the DCSD to fund a district wide upgrade of this program in all schools. This will allow everyone to have access to an audio distribution center that can call for help using closed captioning tied to the teachers Roger Mic System. This system connects to the student's hearing aids.

The DHH program uses a touch screen called Roger that allows all hard of hearing students to hear the teacher. There are 563 students in the district that can't pass the basic hearing tests out of 61,000 students district wide. 322 students have a formal plan. The staff has grown to 6 full time audiologists and 3 techs. There are 14 teachers for the deaf.

The one event that Jodi initiated is a Carnival that helps kids meet other kids in their same position. Some kids don't realize that there are others with the same problems they have.

We have been donating to this program since 1999 when we chartered our club.

Jodi was joined by Aiden, who has been a student with hearing loss. He is a recipient of the advantages that Roger gives hard of hearing students. He talked about how this has helped him with learning and he is a valuable asset to the DCSD technical assistance program.

We presented Jodi with our Annual Donation to their program. She will be using it to help a student who has an unusual hearing problem and needs specialized hearing aids costing \$4000. Her parents do not have insurance and this will allow them to give her this wonderful gift.



### RMD Foundation

On May 21st Chris Scurto, President of the RMD Foundation, was our guest speaker.

The RMD Foundation was organized to help Kiwanis Clubs do more with the money they have by granting funds. There are 3 Castle Rock Kiwanis members who are part of this foundation board from both our club and the Impact Club. They have given out more money in the last 3 years than the previous 10 years. Clubs can now apply anytime of the year instead of having a deadline based system.

Some of the things that the foundation has funded are an Irrigation System for the Salvation Army north of Boulder; a Community Garden; football helmets for the Trinidad Little League and A clothing closet for a Glenwood Elementary School. These projects were sponsored by local Kiwanis Clubs.

Thank you to Chris for updating us on all that the RMD Foundation does to support our Kiwanis Clubs.
